Established: 1977

Special Attractions: Fairy Queen (oldest working steam engine), Patiala State Monorail, and simulators for interactive learning.

Rewari Steam Centre, Haryana: Home to restored working steam locomotives.

Howrah Railway Museum, West Bengal: Displays the heritage of Eastern Railways.

Mysuru Rail Museum, Karnataka: Outdoor exhibits and heritage carriages.

Chennai Rail Museum, Tamil Nadu: Focuses on Southern Railways' heritage and artistic exhibits.

Nagpur Narrow Gauge Rail Museum, Maharashtra: Dedicated to narrow gauge locomotives and lines.
